Cuba And International Project

Through seminars at local churches and institutions, we teach how to start and run businesses to help overcome poverty and improve the well-being of communities.

We partner with Campus Crusade representatives, incorporating Christian principles into our teachings as we talk to students at universities and community groups. We also support mission pastors, churches, and other groups on a case-by-case basis. For example, in Cuba we helped fund over 55 pastors at mission and house churches as they work to establish new churches.

Several thousand have now attended our seminars over the past 20 years. The team has also worked in Kenya, Nicaragua, Ghana and Cuba on similar outreach work and seminars, and are currently working in the Dominican Republic.

"The feedback has been very gratifying. One church in Cuba shared how our previous visit inspired them to start a number of small businesses that have helped their congregation counter poverty. In Nicaragua, numerous university students came forward to accept Christ." - Jerry Low, Team Lead
